Rheumatic Fever

The District Health Board has written to us to say that Fairburn School will soon become part of a Rheumatic Fever Prevention Programme in schools whereby any students with sore thoats will be able to have these swab-tested. The public health nurse will take the throat swab to see whether there is a streptococcal infection causing it. If there is, children should be treated with antibiotics to clear the infection as soon as possible. This preventative programme is very important as Otahuhu is part of a larger area of Auckland that has an increased rate of Rheumatic Fever (which starts with an untreated "strep throat" infection). You cannot "catch" Rheumatic Fever from someone else, but "strep" throats can be passed on to others by coughing or breathing over them. It is important to know that not all "strep throats" turn in to Rheumatic Fever but it is more likely if the sore throats

are left untreated. You need to find out if a sore throat is caused by a "strep" bacteria and get this treated because if it does develop in to Rheumatic Fever, it can cause serious health problems. This could include damage to the heart – in particular the heart valves - which is permanent. The health nurses will be providing these throat swabs free for our students. Parents will be notified when the programme is about to start and permission will be sought for your children to be tested.

Teachers will continue to remind children about using tissues to blow their noses, washing their hands and drying them properly and covering their mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing. We appreciate you reinforcing this at home with your family.
